European powers ready to reimpose Iran sanctions

UNITED NATIONS

BRITAIN, France and Germany have told the United Nations they are ready to reimpose UN-mandated sanctions on Iran over its nuclear programme if no diplomatic solution is found by the end of August, according to a joint letter.


The letter to UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres and the UN Security Council says the three European powers are "committed to use all diplomatic tools at our disposal to ensure Iran does not develop a nuclear weapon".

"Iran must not be allowed to acquire nuclear weapons under any circumstances," French Foreign Minister Jean-Noel Barrot said on X, posting a copy of the letter. "If Iran continues to violate its international obligations, France and its German and British partners will reimpose the global embargoes on arms, nuclear equipment and banking restrictions that were lifted 10 years ago at the end of August," Barrot added.

In the letter, the foreign ministers from the so-called E3 group threaten to use a "snapback mechanism" that was part of a 2015 international deal with Iran that eased UN Security Council sanctions. Under the deal, which terminates in October, any party to the accord can restore the sanctions. All three have stepped up warnings to Iran about its suspension of cooperation with the International Atomic Energy Agency.

That came after Israel launched a 12-day war with Iran in June. The United States staged its own bombing raid during the war. "We have made clear that if Iran is not willing to reach a diplomatic solution before the end of August 2025, or does not seize the opportunity of an extension, E3 are prepared to trigger the snapback mechanism," said the foreign ministers of France, Britain and Germany.

Very severe consequences unless Putin halts Ukraine war: Trump

Viable chance for truce, says Starmer after talks with US president

LONDON/BRUSSELS

US President Donald Trump on Wednesday said there will be "very severe consequences" if Russian President Vladimir Putin doesn't agree to end the war after Friday's summit in Alaska.

He also said he was planning a second meeting with Russian counterpart soon after Friday's Alaska summit, this time with Ukraine leader Volodymyr Zelenskyy included. Trump is due to sit down with Putin in Anchorage on Friday, the first meeting between the Russian leader and a sitting US president since 2021.

"If the first one goes okay, we'll have a quick second one," he told reporters. "I would like to do it almost immediately, and we'll have a quick second meeting between President Putin and Zelenskyy and myself, if they'd like to have me there."

Meanwhile, British Prime Minister Keir Starmer said there was now a "viable" chance for a Ukraine ceasefire, ahead of talks between US President Donald Trump and Russia's Vladimir Putin.

"For three and a bit years this conflict has been going, we haven't got anywhere near... a viable way of bringing it to a ceasefire," Starmer told a meeting of European leaders.

"Now we do have that chance, because of the work that the

(US) president has put in," he told reporters on a video conference which came before Friday's Alaska summit.

In a post on X, Nato Secretary General Mark Rutte said "the ball is now in Putin's court" following the call with Trump, Zelenskyy and other European leaders. "We are united in pushing to end to this terrible war against [Ukraine] & [achieving] just and lasting peace," he wrote. Rutte has also thanked Trump for his "leadership and close coordination with" Europe.

EU chief Ursula von der Leyen hailed a "very good call" with Trump. "Today Europe, the US and NATO have strengthened the common ground for Ukraine. We will remain in close coordination. Nobody

wants peace more than us, a just and lasting peace," von der Leyen said on X.

Ukraine must be part of any further talks following the planned meeting in Alaska, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz said. "Ukraine must be at the table when follow-up meetings take place," Merz said adding "a ceasefire must come first" before any peace negotiations. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Russia should face new sanctions if it does not agree to an "immediate ceasefire" at the summit with Trump.

"We hope that the central topic at the meeting will be a ceasefire. An immediate ceasefire," Zelenskyy said after a call with Trump and European leaders.

Court gives green light to Don's aid cuts

WASHINGTON

A divided US federal appeals court ruled on Wednesday that President Donald Trump's administration can go ahead with billions of dollars in cuts to foreign assistance programs.

The US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit, in a 2-1 decision, overturned a ruling by a lower court that the aid payments appropriated by Congress should be restored.

Trump froze billions of dollars in foreign aid spending after taking office in January and began shutting down the US Agency for International Development (USAID). USAID has long been the primary US government organisation for distributing humanitarian aid around the world.

District Judge Amir Ali, an appointee of former president Joe Biden, issued a temporary restraining order earlier this year prohibiting Trump from suspending foreign assistance funds approved by Congress for fiscal year 2024. But the appeals court reversed the district court ruling, saying grant recipients who brought the case lacked the legal standing to bring the suit.

No foreign intervention, Lebanon's president tells Iran official

BEIRUT

LEBANON'S president told a top Iranian security official Wednesday that Beirut rejects any foreign intervention in its internal affairs and wants Lebanon to remain stable and secure for the good of its people.

Ali Larijani, secretary of Iran's Supreme National Security Council, is the most senior Iranian official to visit Beirut since the Lebanese government

voted last week for a US-backed plan to disarm the Iran-backed Hezbollah group by the end of the year and implement a ceasefire with Israel.

Iran has lambasted the plan, while Hezbollah has refused to

recognise it and vowed not to disarm. The Mediterranean country has been under international pressure to get the militant group to lay down arms after a bruising war with Israel that ended with a US-bro-

kered ceasefire in November. "Lebanon desires cooperation with Iran within the framework of sovereignty and friendship that are based on mutual respect," President Joseph Aoun said.

Israel forces making aggressive incursions into Gaza City: Hamas

GAZA CITY/JERUSALEM

A Hamas official said on Wednesday that Israeli forces were making "aggressive" incursions into Gaza City, after the military approved the framework for a new offensive in the territory.

"The Israeli occupation forces continue to carry out aggressive incursions in Gaza City," Ismail Al-Thawabta, director general of the Hamas government media office in Gaza, told AFP.

"These assaults represent a dangerous escalation aimed at imposing a new reality on the ground by force, through a scorched earth policy and the complete destruction of civilian property."

Meanwhile, the Israeli military said it had approved the framework for a new offensive in the Gaza Strip, as Hamas condemned what it called "aggressive" Israeli ground incursions in Gaza City.

The approval for the expanded offensive comes days after Israel's security cabinet called for the seizure of Gaza's largest city, following 22 months of war that have created dire humanitarian conditions in the Palestinian territory.

Zamir "approved the main framework for the IDF's operational plan in the Gaza Strip," a statement released by the army said.

Prime Benjamin Netanyahu's government has not provided a precise timetable for when Israeli troops will enter Gaza City.

Sabah Fatoum, 51, who lives in a tent in the Tal al-Hawa neighbourhood of Gaza City told AFP by phone that "the explosions are massive" in the area.
