Nine of a family killed in fire accident in Hyderabad

Chemicals stored in ground floor of residential building caught fire

A fire that ravaged the ground floor of a five-storey residential building at Bazarghat in Nampally left nine people, including four women and a child, dead on Monday morning.

The victims, all members of the same family, succumbed to asphyxiation caused by toxic smoke, as the flames were contained to the ground floor but the smoke enveloped the entire building, trapping them inside.

The victims were identified as Mohammed Azam (58), Rehana Sultana (50), Tahoor Farheen (35), Faiza Sameen (26), Tarooaba (13), Tooba (5), Md Za-keer Hussain (66), Nikath Sultana (55) and Haseeb-ur-Rahman (32). The ground floor, used for storing chemicals, including oil used in the production of cooling systems, became a tinderbox, leading to the rapid spread of the fire.

DCP M Venkateshwarlu said the fire spread rapidly and thick smoke spread over the building even as the personnel evacuated the families from the building. Chemical tins and

drums, raw materials, polyester resin etc were stored on the ground floor though it was meant for parking, an official said. Additional DCP Vikram Singh Mann explained, "They died of asphyxiation and were not charred to death."

According to fire department officials, 10 people were found unconscious on different floors of the building. They said that those trapped on the upper floors were not able to come

down and inhaled smoke which caused deaths, they said.

Governor Tamilisai Soundararajan and CM K Chandrasekhar Rao expressed shock at the tragedy. The CM announced an ex-gratia of ₹5 lakh to the kin of deceased. Union Minister G Kishan Reddy and IT Minister KT Rama Rao visited the site and AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi requested the chief secretary to give relief amount of ₹10 lakh.

Fund misuse plea against KL CM rejected

IN a morale-boosting victory for the ruling LDF in Kerala, the Lokayukta on Monday gave a clean chit to Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and 18 members of his previous cabinet in a case related to the alleged misuse of Chief Minister Distress Relief Fund (CMDRF).

A full bench of the Lok Ayukta said there was no evidence to prove either nepotism or corruption in the cabinet decisions to give ₹25-lakh financial aid to deceased NCP leader Uzhavoor Vijayan's family, ₹9-lakh assistance to the late MLA K K Ramachandran Nair's kins and ₹20-lakh aid to the family of a police official killed in an accident.

The bench, comprising Lokayukta Justice Cyriac Joseph and Up Lokayuktas Justice Haroon Al Rashid and Justice Babu Mathew P Joseph, said there was no substantial ground to state that the decisions were taken due to political considerations.

Justice Cyriac Joseph, however, observed that though the cabinet was competent to take the decisions, the process was defective. There's substance in the allegation that the decisions were taken in deviation of extant rules and norms.

"There were no applications received from any of the beneficiaries of these decisions. The



subject was not included in the agenda for cabinet meeting. There was no cabinet note for the consideration of the members of the cabinet... There was no justification for denying the authorities an opportunity to process applications, in accordance with the rules and to place the matter before the cabinet with an agenda note to enable the members of the cabinet to take a fair decision," he said.

He said the three decisions were taken in an arbitrary manner. However, it does not necessarily mean that the allegations of abuse of position, corruption, favouritism, nepo-

atism and lack of integrity have been substantiated. "There's no sufficient material to come to the conclusion that the decisions were taken solely for political benefits," he said.

On whether the decisions taken by a cabinet can be subject to probe under the Lokayukta Act, Justice Cyriac Joseph said the complaint was maintainable and can be investigated. However, the Upa Lokayuktas dissented. Justice Harun Al Rashid observed that a decision taken by the cabinet, which is a constitutional body, stands outside the purview of the Act.

Petitioner R S Sasikumar said he would approach the HC against the Lokayukta's verdict. The Opposition UDF also came out against the verdict.

Man flees with ₹60k worth crackers

A man, impersonating as an Income Tax official, absconded with firecrackers worth ₹60,000 from a shop in Vikrawandi on Saturday night.

The police said, a man arrived in a car with the Government of India and Income Tax department stickers pasted on it and collected crackers worth ₹63,475. He acted like making a UPI transaction and then said

it failed due to network issues.

"However, he made the workers to load the crackers in his car and went inside the vehicle as if to get more cash from a bag. Suddenly, he started his vehicle and fled the scene," said a police officer privy to the investigation.

The staff tried to chase the car but he escaped. A case has been filed at Vikrawandi police station based on a complaint from the cracker shop owner, Vasu. A probe is on.

SC sets deadline for TN to fill 327 judicial posts

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court has taken note of 327 vacancies, out of total sanctioned strength of 1,369 judicial officers in lower courts in Tamil Nadu, and passed directions to fill these posts in a time-bound manner.

A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra took note of submissions of Additional Advocate General Amit Anand Tiwari, appearing for the state government, that steps are being taken to fill up posts of district judges, senior civil judges and junior civil judges in TN.

"The process to fill up these vacancies has to be completed in a time-bound manner," the CJI said on November 9.

The top court, dealing with a 2006 plea relating to the improvement of judicial infrastructure including filling up of vacancies in lower judiciary across the country, passed a slew of directions on the issue pertaining to TN and Puducherry.

As per the October 11 report of the registrar general of the high court, the total sanctioned strength of judicial officers in the state is 1,369 and they are in the cadre of district judge, sen-

ior civil judge and junior civil judge.

"In the cadre of senior civil judge, out of a sanctioned strength of 364, there are 77 vacancies," the bench noted. "In the cadre of Junior Civil Judge, out of a sanctioned strength of 656, there are 166 vacancies," it said. Issuing timeline, the bench, in its order, noted the submission that to fill up 166 vacancies of junior civil judges, the main written examination was held on November 4 and 5 this year.

"The process shall be concluded positively on or before 31 December 2023. Appoint-

ment orders shall be issued before the end of February 2024," it said.

On filling up of vacancies of senior civil judge, the bench was told that the process was being undertaken keeping in view of the large number of vacancies in the feeder cadre.

The bench was told that in the district judge category, 50 vacancies were advertised under the direct recruitment category.

"The preliminary test has been concluded. The entire selection process shall be concluded before 31 March 2024," the bench said. PTI

WHILE Keerthivel Durai, Mayilanandan and Poovarasani died on the spot, Ragavan and Ilayaraja were seriously injured. Locals rescued them and sent the injured to Sathyamangalam Government Hospital for treatment. Ragavan died on the way to hospital. Ilayaraja, who was admitted to the government hospital, was later shifted to a private hospital in Gobichettipalayam in Coimbatore. He is critical, the police said.

One injured in Kalapet pharma firm blast dies

A blast at Solara Pharma company in Kalapet on November 4 claimed the life of a worker on Sunday night. The condition of three other injured workers remain critical.

According to a medical bulletin issued by the director of Health and Family Welfare G Sriramulu on Monday, the deceased has been identified as Nedunchezian (34) from Killianur; Yuvraj (19), Sagar Jena (22), and Raghupathy (30) are in critical condition and are attended by experts at Apollo Hospital in Chennai, added the bulletin.

As many as 11 people were injured in the blast. Seven suffered moderate burns and five of them have been discharged. Venkatchalam (48) and Arulvel (31) are still under treatment and are stable.

District Collector E Vallavan said that a meeting with the management of the pharma company will be held on Tuesday for providing compensa-

tion to the family of the deceased employee and a magisterial probe will ascertain the cause of the explosion. Two other workers had died in a similar accident at the factory some time back and the government is viewing it seriously, he said.

Meanwhile, AIADMK demanded a compensation of ₹1 crore to the family of the victim and ₹50 lakh for the injured workers. Party unit secretary A Anbazhagan said that though a complaint was lodged regarding the industrial fire incident at Kalapet police station, no FIR has been registered against anyone of the company so far.

The home minister and DGP should take action against the concerned police officer for not acting on the complaint. He also demanded Lieutenant Governor Dr Tamilisai Soundararajan to order for an investigation and the company must remain shut till then. The CM and L-G should issue a white paper on the status of this industrial accident, added Anbazhagan.

No landline phone in 50% edu offices: RTI

REPLYING to Right to Information (RTI) question filed by TNIE, school education department stated that 50% of 152 district educational offices in TN do not have landline phones. The reply further revealed there are no Common User Group (CUG) mobile numbers for the 133 district educational offices out of 152, and only 19 DEOs are using CUG numbers.

As per the reply, out of the 152 district educational offices, landline phones are available in 76 offices. Of these, the phone numbers are functioning in only 22 offices.

A teacher aspirant, C Anusree of Kanuvai in Coimbatore, told

TNIE, "Two years ago, applications were invited at government schools for temporary teacher posts. In order to clear some doubts regarding this, I had to go to Perur education office, 15 km away, as their phone remained unresponsive."

Ravi, a parent from Selvapuram, told TNIE, "As I delayed fee payment, the school refused entry to my son. I tried contacting the chief education officer's, but it was inactive (for the past four years). Later, I went to the office and they directed me to lodge a complaint at the education office for private schools at Ondipudur. When I asked for a contact number, the staff said there is no landline at the office."

A district educational officer told TNIE, "In 2018, around 50 new offices were set up to strengthen administration but officers failed to ensure landline. In 2018, officers stopped funding for land and CUG numbers. Except a few, all numbers are inactive," he said.

A top educational officer in Chennai said that steps are being taken to provide CUG numbers for all offices and their functioning would also be ensured.

TN Teachers and School Protection general secretary R Ramkumar told TNIE that there is a court order that government should upload all their circulars on the official website, but there are no details about address and contact number of district education offices.

Bus conductor steals tickets worth ₹9 lakh

KALLAKURICHI police registered a case against a TNSTC bus conductor for stealing tickets worth ₹9 lakh and issuing them to the public while on duty.

As per the police, an audit conducted at the TNSTC depot showed tickets amounting to ₹9,02,520 missing. During an inspection on a bus from Kallakurichi-Villupuram on November 7, a checker found the missing tickets had been distributed. When questioned, bus conductor K Tamilarasan failed to provide a satisfactory response and the checker reported the incident.

Following an inquiry, S Murugan, GM of Kallakurichi depot, lodged a complaint against Tamilarasan on Saturday. A case was filed and a probe is on.
