## Educator, champion of women's rights Mary Roy passes away at 89

MARY ROY, educator and women's rights activist, whose legal battle spanning nearly three decades, ensured equal rights for Syrian Christian women in their ancestral property, passed away at her home in Kottayam on Thursday. She was 89.

Mother of Booker Prize-winning author Arundhati Roy, Mary was also an academician and a champion of gender equality. She established Corpus Christi School in Kottayam,

which was later renamed Pallikkoodam School. Unheard of then, the school adopted a new form of teaching style, offering holistic education that encouraged students to think critically and question conventions.

Born in a Syrian Christian family in 1933, Mary Roy realised the perils in the lives of Christian women when she was asked to vacate her home in Ooty after the death of her father P V Isaac, an entomologist. Mary had her schooling in Delhi and completed her college education

at Queens Mary College in Chennai. She married Rajib Roy while working in Kolkata (then Calcutta). Due to marital issues, she returned to her father's house in Ooty with her two small children (Lalit and Arundhati) in the early 1960s.

However, she was forced to vacate the property by her brother George Isaac. She was told that under the Travancore Christian Succession Act of 1916, a Syrian Catholic woman was entitled only to one-fourth of the value of the property that goes to a son

or Rs 5,000, whichever was less. As per the act, a widow who returned to her parental home

could enjoy the ancestral property until she died or remarried.

Since Mary's father did not leave behind a will, she began her legal battle for equal rights for Syrian Christian women. Then aged only 27, she challenged the archaic law and got a favourable verdict from the Madras High Court as the Ooty property, in Tamil Nadu, was governed by the Indian Christian Succession Act, 1925. Under this Act, all the children and the widow are eligible for equal

share in the property. As a gesture of goodwill, her mother and siblings handed over their shares in the Ooty property to her.

But, Mary realised that things were more or less the same back home where she left Ooty to settle down in her hometown of Kottayam, where she started the Corpus Christi school. The Travancore Christian Succession Act, which prevailed in the region, denied her an equal share of her family's property. She challenged this in the Supreme Court and the Act was repealed

by the apex court in 1986 with retrospective effect from 1951.

"My battle was not for a piece of property, but to ensure that women in this country enjoy the rights guaranteed by the Constitution," Mary had said after winning the case. Mary Roy returned the property which she won after the long legal battle to her brother George Isaac later.

She is survived by daughter Arundhati Roy and son Lalit Roy. The funeral rites will be held at a private function at her home in Kottayam at 11 am on Friday.

HIGHLIGHTING the transformation of BJP ruled states in development front, Prime Minister Narendra Modi urged Keralites to support BJP to stimulate development. "The people of Kerala have faith in the BJP as they have realised that the BJP government is striving to bring a change through development. The speed of development is double in BJP ruled states as they have a double engine government. If Kerala gets a double engine government it will stimulate development," he said while addressing a BJP rally at Nedumbassery in Ernakulam district on Thursday.

The Prime Minister arrived in Kochi on a two-day visit to induct INS Vikrant, India's first indigenous aircraft carrier into Indian Navy and to launch a slew of development projects in the state.

Modi, who started his speech in Malayalam wished Keralites a happy Onam and listed out the welfare projects implement-

ed by the Union government. "The Union government gives priority for the empowerment of the poor; Dalit and the underprivileged. More than 36 lakh people in Kerala have availed benefits of the medical assistance scheme and the Centre has distributed ₹3,000 crore for treatment of the poor," he said.

The PM said the youth, especially girls pursuing nursing courses will benefit from the Central scheme to open one medical college in each district. The government has spent ₹1

lakh crore on projects to improve infrastructure facilities in Kerala. He said the Centre is implementing ₹50,000 crore road development projects in Kerala and has spent ₹3,500 crore for development of village roads. All gram panchayats in the state have been provided high speed internet through optical cable network. During lockdown around 1.5 crore people in Kerala were provided free ration at an expense of Rs 6,000 crore.

The Prime Minister said corruption is the biggest impediment in India's march towards development.

Amit Shah to reach Kerala today  
T'Puram: Union Home Minister Amit Shah will arrive in the state capital on Friday evening to attend the Southern Zonal Council meeting hosted by the state government at Kovalam on Saturday. BJP district president V V Rajesh told reporters here. Shah will arrive at T'Puram airport at 5.30 pm on Friday. Shah will inaugurate the 30th Southern Zonal Council meeting.

"When the government initiates action against corruption, we are witnessing a new polarisation of political parties to protect the corrupt, I urge you to remain alert against the move to protect the corrupt," he said.

Modi concluded his speech paying tributes to the great seers of Kerala including Adi Shankaracharya, Sree Narayana Guru, Chettambi Swami, Ayya Vaikunta Swamikal and Mahatma Ayyankali.

IN the past 24 hours, Kovilpatti received 10 cm of rainfall as per the data collected by 8 am on Thursday. Researchers have attributed the cause of this rainfall to conjunction of westerlies and easterlies winds.

Thoothukudi received 8.21 mm of average rainfall including 16 mm at Kadalkudi, 107 mm at Kovilpatti, 17 mm at Kalugumalai, 2 mm at Ottapidaram and 14.1 mm at Srivakuntam.

A private weather researcher T Raju from Tiruchendur, has said that the conjunction of westerlies and easterlies winds triggered by the upper air circulation is the reason very heavy rainfall occurred during a short period of time.

The heavy rains had submerged the main thoroughfare in the Kovilpatti town including the main road, Anna bus stand, Mathankovil road, Pudhuroad and Pasuvanthanai road. According to IMD, Thoothukudi received excess rainfall of 94.2 mm as against the expected average of 32.7 mm, between June 1 to September 1. This has registered an increase of 188%.

### Katchanatham murder: Accused on the run arrested from Chennai

Sivaganga: 'Sullan' Karuppaiah, an accused in Katchanatham Schedule Caste (SC) murder case, who was on the run, was arrested by a special police team from Sivaganga, in Chennai on Tuesday. He was later remanded in Madurai Central Jail, on Wednesday. 27 out of 33 persons were found guilty by a special court on August 5. They belonged to a dominant community and were convicted for murdering 3 Scheduled Caste persons from Katchanatham village in May 2018. Five other SCs including Dhanasekaran (32) – who later died – were grievously injured. The violence occurred following a dispute between the two communities over bestowing of temple honours. "Sullan Karuppaiah who was hiding for the last four years was arrested. The trial will soon start and after the hearings are completed, the court will pronounce its judgment," a police officer said.
